


## President's Corner

## 2023 Membership Renewal Changes



All, the PSA Board has decided changes are needed to help the PSA function more efficiently, cost effectively and streamline its operations.

These changes are as follows in relation to Membership renewal dates which currently are all over the year depending on the month you originally signed up to the PSA.

Your renewal will be prorated based on the quarter you joined.

Renewal fee per quarter due in January 2023

Jan 1st to March 31st = \$35.00 (Digital) or \$50.00 (Printed)

April 1st to June 30th = \$26.25 (Digital) or \$38.75 (Printed)

July 1st to September 30th = \$17.50 (Digital) or \$30.00 (Printed)

October 1st to December 31st = \$8.75 (Digital) or \$21.25 (Printed)

# South Texas Plumeria Society



2022 has been a good year for the PSST in Corpus Christi. The big event for the club was putting the plumeria collection to bed for the winter in a winter storage greenhouse at the South Texas Botanical Garden and Nature Center. As any grower of plumerias knows, winter storage is a very important activity in the management of a plumeria collection no matter what the size of the collection.

The PSST collection has nearly 100 plumeria of various sizes in it and the plumerias are placed in storage in stages working around the weather. The first step was for volunteers to trim off all of the leaves from the trees. A week or so later, PSST members and other volunteers dig up every plumeria, and place them bare-rooted into the 15 x 30 foot greenhouse where they will spend the winter under close monitoring by the club's collection curators and collection manager. As anyone living from the Houston/Galveston area going southwest to Corpus Christi the winters are unpredictable. You walk a fine line between the greenhouse being too hot during warm sunny days which can cause the branches to desiccate and lose too much moisture to having hard freezes and power outages that can cause freeze damage and destroy the trees as happened in 2021 when almost the entire collection was lost. To mitigate these problems PSST members monitor the weather, make frequent visits to the Botanical Gardens to check on the collections status, and work closely with the staff at the Botanical Gardens to release excess heat by opening the greenhouse doors and the end wall vents. There is also a propane heater available for cold weather emergencies.

It was a great summer for plumeria growth in Corpus Christi and the trees have increased in size significantly, getting them all into the greenhouse was quite a process. To save space, many of the plumerias had to be trimmed back first before putting into the greenhouse. Then the magic begins, the branches of the trees are gently intertwined like a large three dimensional puzzle when they are placed in storage. This always causes interesting problems in the spring as this puzzle has to be taken apart without breaking too many branches. No broken branch goes to waste as they are all collected and distributed among the PSST members or sold at the Spring Big Bloom Sale at the South Texas Botanical Gardens and Nature Center.

We closed out the year with a great Christmas Party and very robust membership that is looking forward to 2023 and another great year of growing plumerias.
